Transfer applicants must have a 3.5 GPA or higher to qualify for admission to the Pre-Nursing major.

The following courses are pre-requisites for NURS 216: BIOL 243/L, CHEM 102, BIOL 244/L.

NURS 112 & NURS 208 are typically taken during a student's first year in the program. Transfer students should plan to take these courses in their first year at USC.
