

# 2025 MTC–USC Direct Transfer Summit: Highlights & Outcomes

**Date:** Monday, May 12, 2025 | **Location:** Close-Hipp University Conference Center  
**Theme:** *Progress and Innovation in Our Partnership*

*The MTC/USC Direct Transfer Partnership continues to serve as a model for transfer excellence in South Carolina, building on a strong foundation of collaboration between Midlands Technical College and the University of South Carolina. Since 2020, academic leaders from both institutions have worked to strengthen educational pathways through the development of Direct Transfer Tracks, annual partnership summits, and engagement with statewide transfer initiatives. The 2025 Direct Transfer Summit, hosted at USC Columbia, welcomed 104 participants from both campuses, including faculty, advisors, and administrators. The event showcased finalized tracks in Psychology and Retail, with several others under active consideration. Key outcomes included expanded course alignment, new ideas for addressing knowledge gaps, and renewed commitments from participants. With ongoing efforts to strengthen collaboration and improve student support, the partnership continues to advance with shared momentum, innovative practices, and a strong focus on transfer student success.*

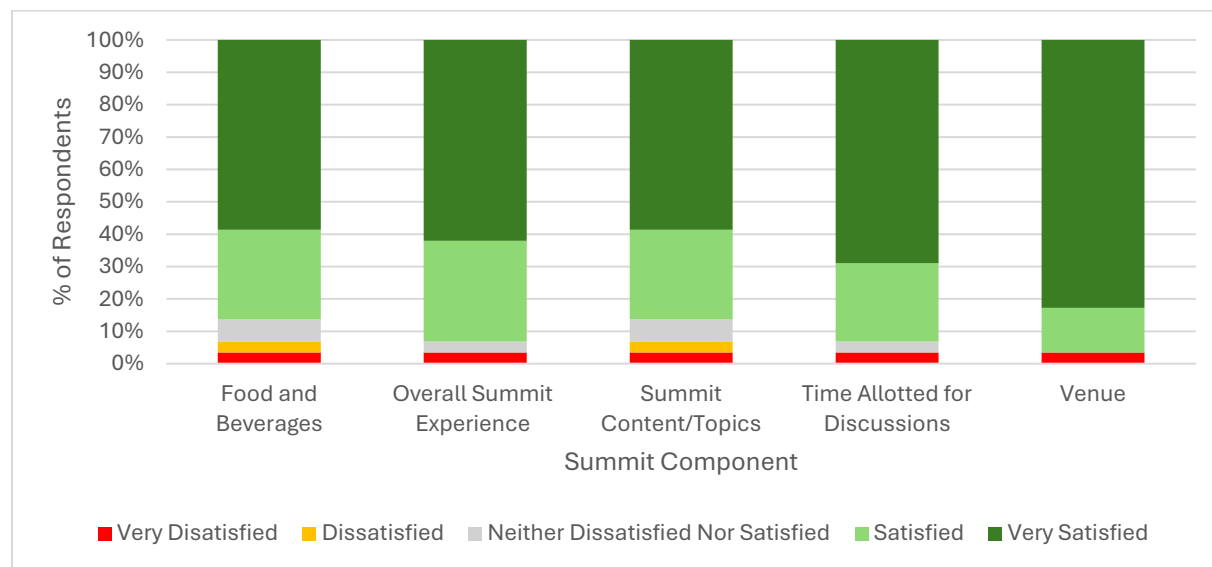
## Participant Feedback

## **Key Takeaways for Leadership**

- Cross-Institutional Synergy: Faculty and staff engaged in hands-on discussion, modeling a collaborative approach to transfer policy alignment.
- Forward Momentum: USC and MTC surfaced new ideas to explore course equivalencies and resolve knowledge gaps in math and other course sequences.
- Commitment to Action: Attendees completed “One Small Step” commitment cards outlining individual follow-ups, emphasizing sustainability of the work post-summit.
- Student Impact Lens: While we continue to work toward data-sharing, both institutions acknowledged the importance of integrating student profiles
  - Future considerations: Identifying student profiles of first-generation and Pell-eligible students
